The one great topic that is more generally discussed than any other, is the relationship between the employer and employee or organized labor and organized capital, and there is every reason to believe that before this century has passed away these two industrial problems will have been solved.

At the present time public opinion is greatly well agreed that capital has the right to organize, but it is very much divided as to whether labor has the right to do so.
