TIME TO END IT.

THE QUEBEC TO MONCTON SECTION.

The work of construction on the eastern division of the national transcontinental railway shall be commenced, as nearly as may be, simultaneously at Moncton, at Quebec, at the point of junction of the eastern division with the branch southerly to a point at or near either North Bay or Nipissing Junction, and at Winnipeg, and shall be carried on westward from Moncton, eastward and westward from Quebec, eastward and westward from the point of junction at Montreal, and eastward from Winnipeg, in such manner that the section between Winnipeg and Quebec, and that between Quebec and Moncton, shall be completed as nearly as practicable at the same time.

This is section 10 of the act of 1904 concerning the national transcontinental railway, also known as the Grand Trunk Pacific. The statute calls for the simultaneous commencement of work by the government at several points on the eastern section.

The transcontinental railway commission has called for tenders for the construction of portions of the eastern section. The portions offered for contract are from Winnipeg east to Lake Superior Junction, and from Quebec west for some two hundred miles.

The only reason suggested for the delay in the call for tenders in respect to the Moncton and Quebec section is that the surveys in this province have not been completed.

Every year the official speech at the opening of the legislative session in this province contains some reference to these demands. Usually the intimation is given that the negotiations are making progress.

If the government had undertaken to construct this railway in the ordinary way, the minister of railways of Quebec are whom the maritime provinces might request for this fall, to carry out the conditions of the transcontinental railway measure.
