REPORTS AND DISASTERS.

New York, Sept. 26—Str Stephano, of the Red Cross Line, arriving here this morning from St. John's, N. B., and Halifax, dented her bow and tipped about a big section of plating while docking in the North River. No one was hurt, but there was considerable excitement aboard. The tide is thought to have caused the accident. A gaping hole was torn in the vessel's starboard side about 20 feet from the stern and about 4 feet above the water line. She was lightly loaded and drawing only about 14 feet of water, otherwise it is feared she would have sunk here. Repairs will be made in dry dock.

FURNACE LINE.

Steamer Shenandoah arrived on Thursday morning early from London via Halifax with a general cargo. The Shenandoah was over to No. 5 berth yesterday afternoon.

DISMASTED BARK AGAIN REPORTED.

Dismasted and short of water, the St. John, N. B. barkentine Hancock was sighted 70 miles east of Cape Ann last Monday by the fishing schooner "Flavilla" at Capt. Nickerson's request. The Hancock is bound for Yarmouth, N. S. with cargo of coal and was damaged by a squall Sept. 9. All hands are reported well. Before report was made by the "Flavilla".

FISHERMAN WASHED OVERBOARD.

Guy Hebbes, aged 25, single, and a native of Nova Scotia, was washed of the bowprit of the schooner Fannie Belle Arrows, which was on Monday and drowned. Capt. Vanambry on arrival at T. Wharf last Tuesday, reported that he and two others were trying to secure the job during a heavy north-east squall 75 miles southeast of Cape Cod. The schooner struck a cross sea and when she recovered from the shock Hebbes was seen astern swimming strongly. A dory was launched and hurried to the man's aid, but he disappeared when the boat had almost reached him.
