# MANY KILLED SCORE INJURED IN WINDY CITY

Sixty Mile Wind Sweeps Chi-cago, Uprooting Trees and Unroofing Houses.

PEDESTRIANS CARRIED FROM THEIR FEET

Many Injured by Falling Trees and Flying Debris from Unroofed Houses.

Chicago, April 19—Several persons were killed and scores injured by a sixty-mile wind that swept Chicago today and uprooted trees, unroofed many bulldings and destroyed hundreds of windows and signs.

Snow flurries and freezing temperatures followed in the wake of the gales which lashed Lake Michigan into fury and caused storm warnings to be sent broadcast to mariners. In the downtown district, all buildings acted as giant wind scoops, shooting the gale into the streets with such force that pedestrians were swept from their feet. A mounted policeman was blown from his horse. At one downtown corner seven wagons were overturned in less than two hours. Many automobile tops were ripped from machines.

Trees Snapped Off.

Tonight the fire department was busy in many outlying sections clearing the streets of trees snapped off or uprooted, fallen signs and electrical wires. One boy was killed by a falling sign, and a man died from injuries received when he was struck by a tree, and another was fatally injured by contact with a live wire.
