


NEW MISSION HALL AT EAST ST. JOHN

PULPIT PREACHER DIES SUDDENLY

Rev. A. B. McDonald, 82 Years Old, Was Preaching in Church at the Narrows When Death Came On Sunday Morning.

Monday, May 6. Rev. A. B. McDonald, of Cambridge, Queens county, died suddenly, yesterday morning at 11.15, while delivering a sermon at the Baptist church at the Narrows. He was spending the Sunday with his brother, Dr. McDonald, of the Narrows, and while preaching from the pulpit he suddenly became unconscious and died a few minutes later.
