Correspondance between Mr. De Busy, Com military of a Grand Master of Malta, cliefted the gib February, and the Covernor of Malta, (Published in the Monicur.)

Letter of the Commander De Busy, to the English Minister at Malta.

" MONSILUR.

" I hid the honour of explaining to your Excellency this morning the object of the million which his most eminent Highness, the Grand Mafter of the Order of Saint John of Jerufalem; has charged me to fulfil at Malti.

"To this explanation your Excellency replied, that you had no orders to evacuate the illand of Malta with the English garrifon, and you gave me to understand, that the Graud Malter would do well not to repair thither.

After reflecting on this answer of your Excellency, I have thought not only that it was unfatisfactory as your Excellency might suppose, but that it required faither explanation.

"As the aniwer of your Excellency feems to contain a refutal to furrender the Ifland or Malta to the Order of Saint John of Jerufalem, agreeably to the roith article of the Treaty of Amiens, and as fuch a violation of this Treaty of Peace may be attended with the most important confequences, and I may even fay confequences facal to the repose of Europe, I cannot reit fatisfied with the verbal answer, which your Excellentry was pleased to give me, and I. hould be wanting to the confidence of the Orand Mafter, as well as to the duty and dignity of that character with which he has invested me, if I did not invite you, Sir, the Minister Plenipotentiary, to explain openly, and in an authentic manner, the motives of a refutal fo unexpected.

" I therefore have the honour to remind your Excellency, that agreeably to the fourth paragraph of the 10th article of the Treaty of Amiens, the forc-s of his Britannic Majefty were to evacuate the ifland and its dependencies in the course of three months after the initication, or source if possible.

"This period has long ago expired. The Treaty addr, "That ifland thall be delivered up to the Order in the fate in which it is, provided the Grand Mafter, or Committioners fully authorifed according to the flatutes of the Order, fhall be in the faid ifland to take poffellion of it, and that the forces to be furnifhed by his Sicilian Majefly fhait have arrived."

" Thefe forces arrived long ago : Nothing then remained to be fulfilled but one condition, namely, the prefence of the Grand Matter, and his Commissioners, to take possession. I have his Commissioners, to take posterior that the honour of obferving to your Excellency that this condition has been fulfilled by the circum-france of my acrival in the Island. His Emipent Highnels, the Grand Mafler, has deigned to give me the quality of his Ambaffador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary to come in his name, " to treat of, negotiate, terminate, accomplish, and concert, with the English and French Ministers Plenipotentiary, as well as with the prefent En. glifh Government of the ifland, on all the articles relating to the return of the religion of Mal ta, and particularly on that the object of which is the difembarkation, and entrance of religion into the ifland, as well as the furrender of the place, &cc." Such are the terms of the full powers of which I am the bearer, and of which I have the honour of fending your Excellency x cory.

"According to the tenour of these full powers, and the accomplishment of the different condicions flipulated by the Treaty of Amiens, for the delivery of the ifland to the Order of Saint John of Jerusalem, I formally demand of your Excellency, the execution of the 4th paragraph of the 10th Article of the faid treaty, and I beg you to give me on this head a precise answer.

" 1 beg your Excellence to accept the affurance of my high effeem. (Signed) " HUSY."

Answer of the Minister of England to the Commander Busy.
