121st Battalion, Lieutenant, Nov., 1915. England, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, Sub-Lieutenant, June, 1916. Motor Launches, Portsmouth, England, Oct., 1916.

Taranto, Italy, Dec., 1916. Coastal Motor Boat Patrol, Dover-Dunkerque, April, 1918. Canada and discharged Lieutenant, April, 1919.

Boyes, David Alexander

M.B.C., Arts, 1907-09.

Lieutenant, 102nd Battalion.

Son of Francis Dickson and Sarah E. Boyes. Born in Clover Valley, B. C., October 27, 1890. Attended local schools, Vancouver High School, and McGill, B. C., 1907-1909.

He enlisted as a lieutenant with the 121st Battalion in December, 1915, having been a member of the 72nd Regiment, Seaforth Highlanders of Canada, for three years previous. He was discharged from the peace-time regiment with the rank of sergeant.

In August, 1916, he crossed to England with the 121st, and was transferred to the 102nd Battalion. He went to France to join the latter unit in January of the following year.

He was killed during the attack on Vimy Ridge on April 9, 1917, and was buried at Villers-au-Bois Cemetery.

Boyes, James Thomas

C.O.T.C., 1915. 46th Battery, Canadian Field Artillery, Kingston, Driver, Jan., 1916. England, Feb., 1916.

France, 45th Battery, Royal Canadian Horse Artillery, July, 1916. Gassed, Vimy, April 15, 1917. Canada
