No student aid increase this year says Oulette

Provincial Minister of Youth, Jean-Pierre Ouellette, has again stated that changes to the provincial student aid program cannot occur this year following a conversation with The Brunswickan, in light of the proposed student demonstration on Thurs-

Ouellette said his department had received a copy of the five demands for changes to the student aid program from the AFS and that the provincial cabinet had discussed the demands in a meeting on Wednesday morning. The result of the cabinet discussion was that they reiterated the government position on student aid in October, in which

When asked whether the demands of increasing the interest free period for repayment of loans and increasing the allocation of living expenses would be included in the next budget, the youth minister replied that those demands are controlled by the federal government through the Canada Student Loan Plan,

When asked to comment on Thursday's demonstration on student aid, Ouellette stated he had received a copy of the five recommendations for changes to the student aid program and had discussed these recommendations with the cabinet. However, changes to the program cannot occur this year and that these recommendations are being considered for the following fiscal year (budget is in the process of being made).


