

Mike Dwyer aids Mississauga Reps Bantams in Metro Hockey League

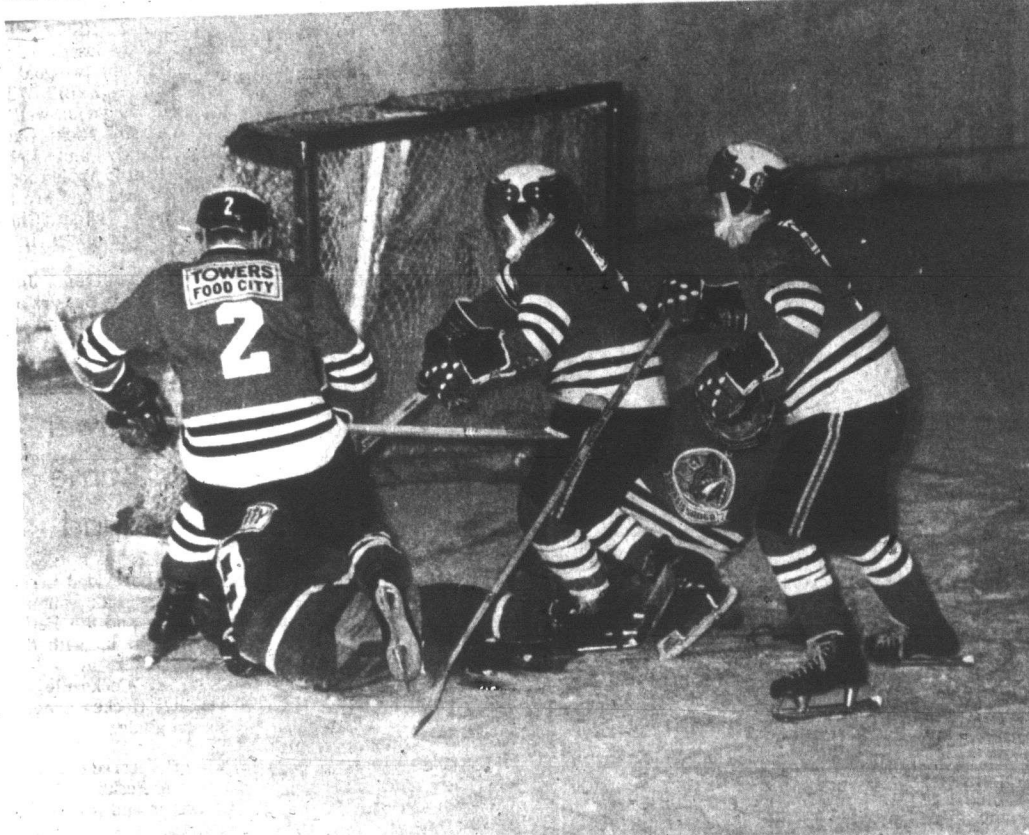
