Wood, <u>OBE</u> , Mr. & Mrs. H.F. Gordon, W/C E.T. Thompson, S/L C.M.H. Stone, <u>A/C W.E. Cockram</u> , and others. Both A/C Cockram and G/C Molson were former members of No. 1 Fighter Squadron.	
	October 6th 1944		Raining, overcast. Flying fit for only two hours dual. Wings Parade for the graduating members of Course 103 was held in No. 1 Hanger. A/V/M A. Raymond, Air Officer Commanding, No. 3 Training Command, presented the flying badges to the graduates. Mrs. Raymond was welcomed on her first visit to the Unit since A/V/M Raymond, then Group Captain, was Commanding Officer here. A bouquet of flowers was presented to her by LAW Griffiths, C.G. Among the R.A.F. graduates, were five British Army officers who were seconded to the R.A.F., all of whom had seen Active Service with their former regiments. (See Appendices "D", "E" and "F".)	
	October 7th 1944		Partly cloudy to clear. A good day's flying put in by Training Wing personnel. Regular Saturday movie was well attended by station personnel.	
	October 8th 1944		Weather clear. No flying on Sunday. Roman Catholic and Protestant Services held in the Station Chapel in the morning.	
	October 9th 1944		Weather overcast, visibility one mile. Very little flying. Beginning of Fire Prevention Week; lectures to be given during the week, as well as demonstrations in fire fighting. Sections who could release personnel were permitted to do so in honour of Thanksgiving.	
	October 10th 1944		Rain and low clouds. No flying during the day.	
	October 11th 1944		Cloudy to occasional overcast. 2½ hours dual flying, six hours solo.	
	October 12th 1944		Weather partly cloudy, haze. Flying for most of the day.	
	October 13th 1944		Partly cloudy, hazy in the morning. Flying for most of the day. Fire prevention demonstration given at 1130 hours on the Sports field. All Station personnel attended.	
	October 14th 1944		Weather overcast with occasional rain. Many personnel attended and enjoyed the movie in the Recreation Hall in the evening.	
	October 15th 1944		No flying. Divine Services in the Chapel were well attended by many personnel.
