Ottawa, July 18, 1908.

Sir,-

I beg to inform you that you and John Regan, of Orillia, have been appointed as Valuers of the timber on the lots contained in the township of Beaucage, and your remuneration will be five dollars each per day, and reasonable living expenses, during the actual work of estimating and valuing the timber, which remuneration will be held to cover everything in connection with this service.

On receipt of this communication you should write to the Secretary of this Department, stating, whether or not, you will accept of the offer, and if you do, when you will commence the work of examination.

The work should be started at once. It will be necessary to examine each lot very carefully and to record in a book that will be sent to you the number of trees thereon of each kind, of nine inches and over in diameter at the stump line, with the average lengths and diameters of same, in order that the proper value of the whole of the timber as it stands on each lot may be ascertained.

After completing the examination, you should return the book to the Department and submit a written report of the general character of the timber with an estimate of the values of the different kinds per M. feet B.M., where it stands in the woods.
