## MARKET REGULATIONS OF THE CITY OF TORONTO.

WHEREAS, it is expedient and necessary to amend the law now in force for regulating the public markets in the City of Toronto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Mayor, &c., as follows:

Sec. I. That the Act of the Common Council, passed on the 11th day of November, 1839, and also an act passed on 29th June, 1840, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

SEC. II. That the market houses and market places now established, or hereafter to be established, within the city, shall be the market houses or market places thereof; and the butchers thereof, or other persons using the same, shall be subject to the regulations following, to wit:—

Sec. III. That any person exercising the trade of a butcher within the said city, shall be previously licensed by the Mayor; and every person selling any meat, less than by the quarter, shall be deemed a butcher, within the meaning of this law, and be subject to the regulations, pains, and penalties thereof.

Sec. IV. That no person shall butcher or slaughter any ox, cow, hog, calf, sheep, or lamb within the said City; and no person, other than a licensed butcher, shall be permitted to butcher or slaughter, for sale, any ox, &c., within the liberties of the said city.

Sec. V. That no butcher or other person shall cut up, or expose for sale, any fresh meat in any part of the city, except in the public markets; nor shall any butcher cut up, or expose for sale, any fresh meat in any other part of the market, except at his regular shop or stall.

Sec. VI. That the market houses shall be the only place for selling fresh meat, before the hour of twelve noon: provided, however, that farmers from the country, disposing of the produce

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
