W. Walker to Neilson. Has been called upon to make a written report of the proceedings of the delegates while in England. Hopes his statements have Neilson's approval. Blind prejudices of some members of the Montreal Association. Montreal, 5th April, 1836.

E. Caron, Mayor, to Neilson. (In French). That he had been appointed a member of the governing committee of the Normal School. Quebec, 9th April, 1836.

L. Legendre to Neilson. (In French). Respecting the survey of the township of Bulstrode. Lotbinière, 10th April, 1836.

G. Moffatt to Neilson. Respecting the selection of Mr. W. Walker as delegate to represent the Montreal Constitutional Association in England. Montreal, 14th April, 1835.

W. Walker to Neilson. Respecting the elections to office in the Constitutional Association. Dissensions in the Montreal branch. Some members have organized a Liberal club. Montreal Association desirous of separating that district from rest of province. Montreal, 23rd April, 1836.

Fragment of a letter, presumably to Neilson, unfinished, but bearing the endorsement in Neilson's handwriting, "Mr. Young." An acknowledgment of a copy of the *Quebec Gazette*, and some reflections on conditions in Canada. 2 Upper Portland Place, 25th April, 1836.

Proposed Organization of a City Government for Quebec on the expiration of the Corporation Act 1st May 1836.

W. Walker to Neilson. No expectation that Montreal Constitutional Association will recover its lost influence. Unwarrantable methods used by members to secure signatures to their petition. General criticism of the Association. Montreal, 9th May, 1836.

W. Walker to Neilson. He and Mr. Moffatt have withdrawn from the Montreal Constitutional Association. Gloomy prospects of the Association. Montreal, 25th May, 1836.

A. Gillespie Jr. to Neilson. Introducing Mr. Carter, a director of the Bank of British North America, of which he speaks favourably. London, 30th May, 1836.

E. L. Montizambert to Neilson. Enclosing the certificate of his election as a delegate for the Upper Town of Quebec, to the meeting of the Select General Committee of the signers of the petitions to His Majesty and both Houses of the Imperial Parliament (the certificate of election of Andrew Stuart and John Neilson accompanies). Monday, 30th May, 1836.

J. Holmes to S. Neilson. Sending astronomical calculations for the *Almanac*; and telling of his proceedings in regard to forwarding education in the Province. Paris, 7th Sept., 1836.

J. E. Ross to J. W. Woolsey. Respecting the proposed construction of a railway between Quebec and Belfast, Maine. Belfast, Maine, 6th July, 1836.

J. Neilson to Gilbert Young, 2 Upper Portland Place, London. Acknowledging letter of 25th April. Political prospects brightening. Upper Canada, loyal, repudiates turbulent spirits in Lower Canada. Introduces the bearer of this letter, Mr. Taschereau. Personal matters. Quebec, 22nd July, 1836.

Resolution of the Executive Committee of the Constitutional Association of Quebec, at a meeting held on the 18th August 1836, that a committee of three be named to prepare a report on the defects in the representation to be laid before the Royal Commission.

C. Hutton to Editor, *Quebec Gazette*. Containing a statement as to a trial which took place between himself and the trustees of a school to which he belonged. 25th August, 1836.
