mine the matter thereof, with power to send for persons and papers, and report with all convenient speed.

The House divided upon the question :

## Yeas 26 Nays 2

So it was carried in the affirmative, and

Resolved, accordingly.

ORDERED, That Mr. Vanfelson, Mr. M.Cord, Mr. Taschereau, Mr. A. Stuart, and Mr. Panet, do compose the said Committee.

Mr. Languedoc, from the Committee to whom was referred the Bill, for the maintenance of good order on Sundays and Holydays, in the Country Parishes of this Province, reported, that the Committee had, gone through the Bill, without making any amendment thereto; and, he read the Report in his place, and afterwards delivered it, with the Bill, in at the Clerk's Table, where it was again read.

On motion of Mr. Languedoc, seconded by Mr. Huot,

ORDERED, That the said Bill be referred to a Committee of the whole House.
