The Houfe being met, a Bill prefcribing the Form of Writs and the Manner of iffuing the fame, was B" preferibing read a fecond Time, and ordered to be committed; and the fame being referred to a Committee of the whole Houfe, Mr. Butler reported to Mr. Speaker, that the Committee had gone through the faid Bill and had agreed to the fame with fome Alterations.

Which being read a third Time, was ordered to Engrofit and feet be engroffed,

to the Council.

Then read a fourth Time, and ordered to be fent up to his Majesty's Council.

The Houfe then entered into the Confideration Confideration on a of Ways and Means for leffening the Province General Tax. Debt, and after fome Debates upon the Expediency of laying a Tax upon the Polls and Eftates of the Inhabitants of the Province, Mr. Speaker put the Queftion to vote, whether a Tax should be made for that Purpose, which was carried in the Negative.

Then adjourned till To-morrow Morning 11 o'Clock.
