The Chairman also acquainted the House, that he was directed by the Committee to move for leave to six again on the consideration of the several Bills to them referred: which report the House agreed to.

Ordered, That the Bills be engrossed.

The Address to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent being engrossed by the Clerk pursuant to Order, and also read to the House, and signed by the Speaker in behalf of the House; thereupon,

Resolved, That Mr Speaker do wait upon his Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor with the said Address, and, in the name of the House, request that his Excellency will be pleased to forward the same to his Majesty's Ministers by the earliest conveyance.

Then the House adjourned until To-morrow, at eleven of the clock.

An engraffed Bill for the preservation of Snipes and Woodcocks was read a third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and that the Title be, An Act for the Preservation of Snipes and Woodcocks.
