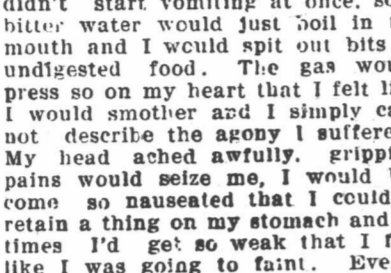

DROCOURT-QUEANT LINE BROKEN IN WHAT MAY BE WAR'S GREATEST BATTLE

Canadian and British Troops Penetrate to Depth of Five Miles; Huns Surrender in Panic, While Abandoned Positions are Piled With Dead

London, Sept. 3.—Telling progress was made by the allies yesterday in the great battle on the western front when Canadian and English troops launched an attack south of the Scarpe River which broke in two the vitally important Drocourt-Queant switch of the Hindenburg line, otherwise known as the Wotan line. The assault, which was launched at 6 o'clock with considerable forces, had as its jumping-off place the position close to the German defences reached several days ago.

By their advance the Canadians and English broke the Wotan line on a two-mile front. They reached the outskirts of Cagnicourt, about two miles north-east of Queant, according to battle front advices, and further north penetrated Dury, more than two miles east of the Wotan line. Far-reaching results may follow yesterday's advance. If the allies gain can be held the Hindenburg line would appear to be completely broken on its northern end. Development of the success in the direction of Douai and Cambrai would threaten the entire German line in the west from the North Sea to Rheims and even beyond.

On the front, between the progress notably towards the northern end they are reported at Bouigny, 4 miles north-east of Bapaume, and they have taken the town of Noreuil, further north in this area.
