STRAIGHT TALK

Is Given by Premier Roblin--He Makes Very Severe Charges Against Liberals in Connection With the Macdonald Election.

WINNIPEG, Jan. 15. — Sir Rodmond Roblin made good his promise to answer to the libel charges regarding the Macdonald election on the floor of the Legislature yesterday. The Premier dealt with charges in no uncertain tone, and not only rebutted the libel charges, but vastly disturbed the Opposition members by a recital of the methods employed in an endeavor to elect the reciprocity candidate. Sir Rodmond in part said:

"Mr. Speaker, I now come to deal with the administration of justice in this province for the references that have been made in connection with the election in Macdonald. In doing so I feel that it is incumbent upon myself and others who stand for honesty and clean elections and good citizenship not to make defence of anything that was done, but I ask for commendation and praise for our efforts to stay the tidal wave of political corruption and immorality that was inundating that electoral division.

"My honorable friend and those associated with him have felt, apparently, that it was in the interests of the Liberal party in this province that misrepresentation, exaggeration and slander should be indulged in to the injury of the province in connection with this election. Now, what are the facts? They are simply these. An election was called in Macdonald. Long before the writ was issued the constituency was invaded, not by Manitoba, but by a horde of political heeled and wire pullers from other parts of Canada, for the purpose of securing a declaration from the people of Macdonald that the conditions in this country were not as good as they were in the United States, and that therefore it was necessary for us to surrender our individuality as a nation and hand over matters and things pertaining to our fiscal affairs, which would make us hewers of wood and drawers of water for the people to the south of us.

"Political Crooks Imported.
 "I give my honorable friend credit for not taking much interest in the election. He was only dragged into it at the last moment and had it not been for interests other than Manitoba I believe he would not have put his foot in that electoral division. The election was directed and controlled by a gentleman of the name of McNutt, of Saskatchewan, and by Frank Oliver, of Alberta.

"They brought with them men from every part of the Dominion. Eleven Frenchmen were brought from Quebec, political crooks from Saskatchewan and Alberta, and they intended to defy the honest opinion of that electorate by means that the law expressly states shall not be employed, but they were prevented from accomplishing their purposes. The right of a public man from Alberta or Quebec to address a public meeting in the electoral division of Macdonald is not questioned; I have been invited and have spoken in every province of this Dominion, excepting one, I think. The right to import political bootlers, the right to bring in men to distribute whiskey to corrupt the electors, the right to import political crooks with money, to purchase votes, is denied, and I take straight issue with my honorable friend and his party in this regard.

"That these men came will not be disputed, because a few of them landed in jail, and many of them should have been kept there for their acts until punished according to the laws of the country. Men were arrested for wrongdoing, and they were not prosecuted after the election was over. I confess here that was a mistake. The Attorney-General's department should have prosecuted and put these men in jail and kept them there until this day, and many of them would have been compelled to stay had the department prosecuted as it now appears we should have done. The reason the department did not prosecute was because we knew they were hired men, paid to come in here by some of the leaders of the so-called Liberal party.

"There was little satisfaction in punishing the poor unfortunate tool when we could not get at the master hand that directed it. Therefore mercy was shown, and, as indicated, was misplaced.

This Girl States That She Was Kidnapped

 NEW YORK, Jan. 15.—Eleanor Oxley, a 15 year old girl, who says she was kidnapped in the street near home in Philadelphia, on Monday, was recovered by her father at her uncle's home in Brooklyn to-day. She escaped from her captors after a train ride with them to Jersey City and made her way to the uncle's home, she says. The girl's father recently served on a federal jury which investigated white slavery in Pennsylvania, but said to-day he did not consider this coincidental with his daughter's abduction.
 Eleanor Oxley was on her way to answer a want advertisement for a stenographer when approached by two men who directed her to accompany them, she told relatives to-day. She refused, and was seized and a handkerchief was placed over her face. She was led to a lot, threatened with death if she cried out or tried to escape, and was taken on a street car to a railroad station, where a train was boarded. At Jersey City, she said one of the men went away, leaving her in the other's care, and when his attention was attracted elsewhere she walked away.
