Addresses Audience 2,000 People-Big Reception

Was Met at the Station By Brass Band-Platform Endorsed

Glace Bay, C.B., Aug. 25.—R. L. Borden, M. P., leader of the Conservative party; J. G. M. Bergeron, M. P., and C. E. Tanner, M. P. P., leader of the party in Nova Scotia, arrived here yesterday afternoon at 2.30. They were met by Rev. Dr. Thompson, J. C. Douglas, second vice-president of the local Conservative Association; C. M. Odell, resident engineer of the Dominion Coal Co., and others. The afternoon was spent in visiting all the surrounding collieries. In the evening Mr. Borden was escorted to King's Theatre, the procession being headed by the local band. The theatre was splendidly decorated and was filled to the doors, hundreds being unable to gain admission. The ladies were in full attendance.

Hundreds of people came from Sydney. North Sydney and other cities to swell the local attendance, and about 2,000 persons listened with interest to the addresses. On the platform were many prominent and representative men of Cape Breton. At the opening of the meeting Mr. Borden was presented with an address from Cape Breton Conservative Association, endorsing his leadership and policy.


