A familiar figure on the Intercolonial Railway passed away Tuesday morning by the death of W. W. Price, station master at Petitediac. He had been ill for some months and was known to be in a serious condition, but rallied several times and dissolution came rather unexpectedly at three o'clock. Deceased was one of the oldest employees in the I. C. R. service, having been on the road since the road opened, and had hundreds of friends. Few men in Canada have been engaged in active railway work longer than deceased. He has been station master at Petitediac for forty-five years, and consequently was well known, not only to employees of the road, but to the travelling public. He was seventy-seven years of age and survived by a widow and a large grown up family. The sons are C. W. Price, train despatcher, Moncton; E. B. Price, locomotive engineer, Campbellton; Dr. O. B. Price, dentist, Moncton, and Horton Price, Sydney. The daughters are Mrs. Fred Seeley, Moncton; Mrs. (Dr.) Daley, Petitediac; Mrs. Lawrence, Petitediac; Mrs. May, Campbellton, and Mrs. Hanson, Bathurst. The late J. E. Price was a son. There are two brothers—Moses, at Petitediac, and Nelson at Boston—Globe.
