Local Red Cross Gather Sphagnum Moss

Make First Shipment To St. John on Saturday—Abundance in Northumberland.

The local branch of the Red Cross Society made its first shipment of Sphagnum Moss to St. John on Saturday when two large bags were forwarded to the Central Committee for shipment to the hospitals of the Allied Armies overseas. The Moss was gathered on Friday near the Brown Road at Chatham Head where it is stated a large amount of the moss can be secured as well as many other points in the County.

Sphagnum Moss is one of the oldest of surgical dressings and was used as far back as the Napoleonic wars but the extensive demand did not materialize until the spring of 1916 when after an experimental test it was found to be one of the most highly absorbent dressings obtainable and after the bogs of Great Britain were stripped of all their moss the attention was then turned to Canada and the United States where it was ascertained that Sphagnum Moss was found in abundant quantities. In New Brunswick much good work has been carried out by the St. John Branch of the Red Cross in gathering the moss and the local branch are the second to take up the work. As all the moss must be gathered before the ground is frozen the Committee expect a strenuous time for the next few weeks.


