

> The Marquis collapsed on March 5 atCambridge; while he was dress ing (p attend a public dinner. It was said at the time that he had suffered from a hemorrage. All his imnediate engagements were cancelled and he was brought back to London the following day.

On March 9 he underwent a serious operat.on; and since that time he had gradually failed.

After Thursday evening's official bulletin; no information regarding the patient was forthcoming; until MONTREAL his death was announced

> The public still is without definite knowledge as to the nature of the illness which necessitated the operation on March 9 'bladder trouble has generally been given as the cause of the collapse which heralded the fatal sickness; the earliest outward manifestation of which was faintness; accompanied by the hemorrhage at Cambridge.

> Death came quietly ending a ca which was notable in many ways. Opinion necessarily is much divided with regard to the political acts of the Marquis but it is conceaed that whatever verdict history eventual'y passes upon him it can not be denied that he was a great Statesman who spent a large part of his life in devoted service to his country a service the demands of which it is believed undoubtedly weakened his y slove which never was very strong.
