

A monster parade of patriotic societies formed in Stephen's Green, and made its way through the mass of people at the north end of Sackville street, where the statue was erected.

Mr. Redmond was the only speaker He paid a glowing tribute to Parnell. Twenty years, he said, seems a long Parnell. But is this not the inevitable hour? A chosen hand guides us in the sequence of events. What noment more fitting than that when we are back to the point to which Parnell led Ireland before the cause was submerged?"

Mr. Redmond declared that there would be an Irish Parliament within twenty-four months, and he advised his hearers to remember the chief's Irishman." He made a plea also for conciliatory attitude toward Ulster. As the statue was unveiled a great cheer was raised. The crowds accompanied by the bands, pipes, bugles; and fifes, sang the hymn The Memory of the Dead," and 'God Save Ireland."


