aken fifteen minutes before each meal and at bedtime is a good preventive for headache if taken when the first symptoms appear.

To keen small screws, brads and acks from rusting, it is best to place them in a small wide-mouthed bottle rightly corked. The bottles should be perfectly dry before using.

Cucumbers turning and carrots should be firm to the touch when fresh Lettuce, if of the headed variety should have firm bleached hearts showing no trace of rust.

The oiled naper which comes around butter, lard, etc., should be carefully emoved and used to line cake tins or es a covering for the steamed pud-

For sunburn and freckles, use half pints of boiling water and let them inuse for two hours. Strain the mix-

ure thoroughly and use as a wash. Chiffon can be renewed by spreadng a wet cloth over a very hot iron and holding the chiffon over the steam intil it is free from wrinkles. The chiffon should be dried quickly.

When plaster of paris is used to fill cracks in the plaster, mix it with vinegar instead of water. It will not hard en so quickly, whereas if water is used the paste will harden before you can successfully use it.

Frying fish can be prevented from bsorbing the grease and becoming sodden if the fat is almost boiling hot efore the fish is put in the pan. A blue smoke will rise from the fat when t is in proper condition.

When it is difficult to remove glass stopper, put a little olive oil round it an hour or so: if it still I sticks, place the whole bottle in warn an ounce of elder flowers into three water and tap the stopper gently on either side. It will surely come out

A sure way to keep flowers fresh, they are being sent to a distance, is to cut slits in potatoes and insert the lower stems firmly in the inserts. A pctato will keep most flowers fresh for two weeks if the temperature is mod-

A blackboard eraser is the handiest thing to use about a stove. Keep it in a convenient place and use it to mor the top of the stove. Grease and dir can be easily removed, and the hands will not come in contact with the black grease.

A very good scouring mixture for boards can be made by working into a paste half a pound of soft soap, half pound of sand-and a quarter pound of lime. Put it on a scrubbing brush instead of soap and then wash off with plenty of clean water.


