Anglesey was forced to apply for a brief leave because he actually did not have a coat to his back. The wear and tear of campaigning frayed the fragile quality of khaki designed by a fashionable tailor, and a piece of shrapnel ripped the whole back out without wounding his lordship.

The Marquis had two uniform coats made during his brief visit. It is curious to note that the last holder of the title of the present Marquis was chiefly famous as the possessor of the most extensive wardrobe in England, which included more than 500 coats.




