CODFISH.—The exports of dried salt trade for the future. bodfish the past week amounted to 22,365 quintals. Of this total 8,859 were sent to Portugal, 7,530 qtls. to Braizl, 5,742 to Spain, and 234 to Braizle Spain, and 234 to Brai Liverpool. Leading Brands here are \$17.25 to \$17.50 wholesale, other grades \$16.50 to \$17.00. The imports are keeping up well.

SUGAR.—Sugar is now controlled by the Food Control Board here, and prices are fixed for the season. A full supply is therefore assured, except interfered with by transportation difficulties of labor strikes. The S. S. "Choctow" and S.S. "Edmund Donald" have brought in large consignments which are being sold by wholesalers at \$28.25 per 100 lbs., and by retailers at 30 cents a lb. The latter so far received no reply from the Board through their delegation, as to allow ing them to ask two cents a pound more in order to make it pay. Although sufficient sugar has been contracted for by the Food Control Board, those who can afford to do so would do well to stock up now. Lower prices are not possible and difficulties may arise later in getting the sugar here.

MOLASSES .- The importation will be very short, and the last quotation for Fancy at Barbados would put molasses up to \$2.05 per gallon wholesale landed in St. John's. Local sales of stocks in hand are being made still at \$1.85 for Fancy and \$1.75 for Choice in the puncheon. There are four of our vessels now at Barbados awaiting cargoes, and it is not certain whether they will all succeed in procuring the way up with loads. At best this will bring the imports up to about 6000 puncheons, which is only about half of the normal supply.

COAL. - There is plenty of coal, hard and soft in town this week. By the S.S. "Montana" 2,400 tons of Anthracite were brought from New York to Harvey & Co. and several small cargoes of soft coal from Sydney There is no scarcity anticipated, and it is quite possible that prices may be easier in July and August.

POTATOES .- The price is unchanged at \$7 for the half barrel and \$14 per barrel. They are getting scarce every day and not likely to be any lower till the new crop comes. There is a fair supply in the city, and some next boat down the gulf.


