

Origin of Alexandra Palace.

The Alexandra Palace at Muswell Hill is practically a reproduction of the buildings of the 1862 London International Exhibition of South Kensington, just as the Crystal Palace represents the "halls of glass" of the first great World's Fair of 1851. On December 9, 1862, Messrs. Kelk and Lucas, who had contracted for the demolition of the exhibition buildings, started work, the interior being first dismantled of all fittings and fixtures. The scaffolding which had served to erect the huge building was then again set up, and by the summer of 1863 all the ironwork, oits, beams, etc., of the nave and transepts were removed and ready for transport to Alexandra Park. > Private Bank Opens Up In Russia.

MOSCOW.-The first private bank in Soviet Russia, the Russian Commercial Bank, begins operations this month. This bank has been organized as a trade bank by H. Ashberg, a Swedish financier, with the aid of American and German capital. The Russian state bank of Moscow has one member on the board and participates in the capital to the extent of 10 per cent The founders of the bank do not intend to finance industry, but will assist in the organization of several limited companies with foreign capital for the development of vital industries. For the purpose of banking operations in Germany a special bank, The Guaranty and Credit Bank for the East, is being organized in Berlin with the aid of the Russian state bank, through which all operations of the new Commercial Bank will pass.

Of the aches and pains that are his to knoow, For the hours are dressed in their richest style Once in a while.


