Class 8, composed of horses for agricultural purposes, is the most interesting to our rural neighbors, and no zealous agriculturist can view without admiration these huge masses of muscle trained to be subservient to the will of man, and to assert his empire over the stubborn earth. No show yard in Ontario has ever witnessed a finer show of animals of this class than London show yard contains at the present time. Many of them are imported, descended from the best strains of English blood through imported ancestors.
