

GOT ITS CEMENT AT VERY REASONABLE PRICE

Corrected Figures Show Winnipeg Profited Largely By Buying in Canada

That Merger Has Caught Up With Orders is Statement Given Out

Winnipeg, July 31.—That the Canada Cement Company has caught up with its orders was the statement made today by W. P. S. Johnson, sales manager for this city.

He further pointed that figures published yesterday regarding the company's successful tender to the city of Winnipeg for 25,000 barrels are in correct to the extent of 30 cents a barrel, the real net price being \$1.96, which is 15 cents under the price paid last year by the city to the Lehigh Portland Cement company, an American firm.

Approximate value of the Helvetia, \$250,000. Approximate value of the 7,000 tons of steam coal at \$4 a ton, \$28,000. Approximate cost of repairs to Empress of Britain, \$100,000. Approximate loss of receipts to the C.P.R. on account of perhaps four trips being cancelled, each trip estimated would net \$75,000, gross \$300,000.
