### THE RATE OF 50,000 PER MONTH

From April Until August 209,642 New Settlers Came; 143,000 From Ocean Ports and 65,000 From States

TTAWA, Ont., Sept. 5.—During the four months from April 1st to August first of the current fiscal year, the current riscal year, 209,642 immigrants arrived in Can-ada. Of this number 143,742 arrived at Ocean ports, and 65,900 from the United States. These figures show an increase of 15 per cent., as compared with those of the corresponding months of last

fiscal year, which were 127,925 at ocean ports and 54,814 from the United States, making a total for the four months, April 1 to August 1, 1911, of 182,793 persons.

During the month of July this year, there were 34,898 arrivals, 21,739 of them having been at ocean ports, and 12,257 from the United States, as against 291,621 for July last year,


