THE MARKETS

Local Market.

London, Saturday, May 12. In view of the threatening aspect of the weather the market was unexpectedly large. The country-folk brought in a general supply of stuff, and in no line were the offerings so large as to effect the prices materially. With only a few variations they have remained stationary during the past week. Meat was offered in fairly large quantities. Quotations in this line are unchanged. The supply of poultry is very limited at present. Small quantities are coming in from the country. Local dealers are all depending, to a large extent, upon the small farmers near the city for their supply. The offering of both butter and eggs were fairly large today, but prices remained firm. Dealers are taking advantage of the present low prices, and the good stock that is being supplied, to replenish their decreased stock of eggs.
