CHESTER GILLETTE'S CASE

Appeal of "Billy" Brown's Murderer To Be Heard in January.

Albany, Nov. 20.—The court of appeals has postponed the hearing of arguments on the appeal of Chester Gillette, convicted of murder in the first degree and sentenced to death for the alleged killing of Grace, or "Billy" Brown, of Otatic, at Big Moose Lake, in the Adirondacks, in the early summer of 1906.

The case was put over on motion of ex-Senator Mills, Gillette's counsel, until the beginning of the term of court which opens Jan. 6, and is expected to come on for argument after the disposal of the calendar of "appeals from orders" which usually occupies the first three or four days of the term.
