is likely that she will eventually be handed over to some institution.

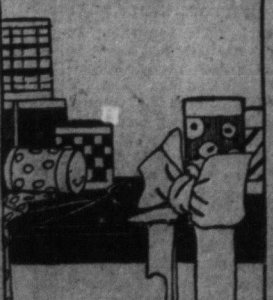
