### ANARCHISPS IN ENGLAND.

Discovery of a Serious and Far-Reaching Plot -Arrests of Conspirators.

LONDON, Jan. 8.-Scotland Yard received a warning, several months ago, of the existence of an anarchist plot, with ramifications in the United States and on the continent. Inspector Melville was given charge of the matter. A close watch was kept on suspi-

matter. A close watch was kept on suspi-cious foreigners in London, and other parts of the country. Melville went to Walsall, near Birningham, to watch a so called socialist club, the doctrines of which were so subservient of all authority as to excite surprise among even the Radicals of that radical town. The inspector became con-vinced that members of the club were plot-ting mischief, and that bombs were being prepared for use against the authorities on the continent, and, perhaps, also in America ent, and, perhaps, also in America and England.

Melville and his assistants ascertained that preparation of the bombs was carried on by members of the club in connection with an anarchist named Deakin, who ap-pears to have been the leader in the busi-




