COUNCIL MEETING.

(Continued from page 2)

There being only, upon vote taken in favour of the said amendment; the Proposer and Seconder thereof, the same was declared lost, and the MAIN MOTION carried.

The Secretary-Treasurer was instructed to forward copies of the said MOTION to Messrs. Kelly and Bugeaud, M.L.C. and M.L.A. respectively.

Moved by Mayor Clapperton, seconded by Mayor N. Cyr, that the following Resolution be passed by the County Council as follows to wit:—

Whereas the waters of the North West Branch of the Grand Cascadepia River are working most seriously inland, dangerously menacing the combination Railway and Highway Bridge across the said river;

Whereas crib work is absolutely and immediately necessary to be constructed so as to prevent the said menace, and that it is of vital importance that the same be done forthwith so as to avoid most serious impending damages:

Whereas the said County Council do respectfully memorialize the Local Government at Quebec of the facts aforesaid hereinabove mentioned, and humbly pray them for an immediate grant from the Public Funds for the said purpose and work, to be forthwith put through this spring;

Further resolved that copies of this present resolution be transmitted to the Railway Commission of Canada at Ottawa, to J. S. Gordon, Esq., General Manager of the Quebec Oriental Railway and to J. F. Bujead, Esq., M.L.A. at Admont.

It was moved by Mayor Adams, seconded by Mayor Busted that:

Whereas the Province of New Brunswick have Statutory Enactments entirely prohibiting and preventing GUIDES belonging to the Province of Quebec entering the said Province of New Brunswick and acting as such during the Hunting Season;

Whereas under the present state of affairs in this Province the New Brunswick Guides are allowed to enter the said Province without any restriction or license whatever;

Whereas the said present condition of things results in an unjust and unfair discrimination against the Guild of our own Province, to their hurt and prejudice:

Therefore be it resolved by the County Council of the County of Bonaventure now in session that the Local Government authorities at Quebec respectfully requested to take up the

matter at issue into their kind consideration, with the Local Government Authorities of the Province of New Brunswick, so as to have the whole fairly and equitably adjusted for

those interested, and failing to have far and just treatment for GUIDES with reciprocal rights and privileges, that the said Local Government Authorities of Quebec do adopt the necessary proceedings so as to bar the New Brunswick Guides from carrying on their occupation as such in this Province:

Further resolved that copies of the present resolution be forwarded to Sir Lomer Gouin, Prime Minister of the Province of Quebec, Hon. J. H. Kellogg, M.L.C. and J. F. Bujeaud, Esq. M.L.A.

It was moved by Mayor Adan
seconded by Mayor air that:
Whereas the cost and expense

operating our COUNTRY SCHOOLS is ever increasing, due to the high salaries that have perforce to be paid to qualified teachers, and to the prevalent and general increase in the cost of everything that pertains to the operating of such schools;

Whereas in many cases, in the Rural and Country Districts, the school boards are obliged to engage unqualified teachers, and in several instances the schools have to be closed altogether, owing to the fact that the school boards are unable to pay the high salaries demanded by the best teachers;

Whereas the County Schools as a rule are greatly handicapped, and are at a great disadvantage as compared with the schools in urban or city districts;

tricts, apart from the fact of our scattered population, the long distances that our children have to travel to school, the condition of the roads, and many other reasons:

Whereas the Government Educational Authorities have this year greatly increased their grants to the Higher schools and higher Branches of Education more favorably situated;

Whereas the children of the Rural Districts are, with few exceptions, unable to take advantage of the said Higher Schools and Universities, and have to depend almost entirely on the Rural School for their education:

Therefore be it resolved by the County Council of the County of Bonaventure now in session that the Local Government at Quebec be respectfully requested and urged to largely increase their grants to the Rural and Country

children of the said rural and country schools, so as to procure for the children of the said schools better chances of education, and thereby confer upon the said children and our rural population the greatest possible benefit;

Further resolved that copies of this resolution be transmitted to Sir Lorne Gouin, Prime Minister of the Province of Quebec, the Hon. Cyrile Delage, Superintendant of Public Instruction of the Province, Hon. J. H. Kelly, M.L.C., and J. F. Bujaud, Esq., M.L.A.—

The Secretary-Treasurer gave communication to the Council of all correspondence received by him since the last meeting in March, all filed of record.

The most important of those was a letter from the Department of Municipal Affairs, Quebec, enclosing copies of the proceedings and plan relating to the detaching of a part of the Muni-

unicipality of Maria to be added to the Municipality of Carleton filed by him among the records of the County Council on the 1st of March instant. After deliberating thereon, without decision or resolution bearing upon the same, the Council laid said proceed-

ings on the table, leaving the matter to the Municipalities interested.

Moved by Mayor Busted, seconded by Mayor N. Cyr, that the Secretary-Treasurer of the County Council be authorized by the same to have a proper Deed of Agreement drawn up between Mr. S. Verge Registrar at Carleton and the County Council, relating to the new Registry Vault recently there erected, in accordance with the previous resolutions bearing on this matter, and to sign the same for and in the name of the Council.—Adopted.

Moved by Mayor Anglehardt, seconded by Mayor Allard that the report of the County Auditors, read by the Secretary-Treasurer upon the annual examination of Receipts and Ex-

Moved by Mayor Clapperton, seconded by Mayor Chapados, that in view of the ever efficient and faithful service

rendered to the County Council, by G. M. Kempffer, Esq., their Secretary and Treasurer, his annual salary as such be increased to three hundred dollars (\$300.00). Adopted.

Moved by Mayor N. Cyr, seconded by Mayor Anglehardt that the sum of five thousand two hundred and fifty-eight dollars and fifty six cents (\$5258.46) be levied upon the local Municipalities of the County according to their respective Valuation Roll so as to defray the current expenditures, according to the following items:


