THE FINANCIAL OUTLOOK.

THINGS MORE SUFFERED IN MONTEAL.

Bank stocks still weak—Federal stocks at 150-15. It is still to be seen a few more days. The financial situation appears to have improved on that of Saturday, though all the trouble is not yet over. Last night it was reported that a large Toronto bank was in trouble by reason of the outbreak of Montreal, but it is not likely that any difficulty will be created by it—there is any one in a tight place it is by reason of something else. The big banks in Montreal are going to see the cotton man through. The stock market is still unsettled and weak. Bank of Montreal has experienced a sharp decline in its Toronto, Merchants Bank, etc. Federal has stood at 150; not by reason of its strength to hold, but because those who controlled the situation agreed to liquidate at that figure. The bears could have sent it down to 140 as easily as they put it to 150, but their own interest was to take the middle course, which gave them a better chance for settlements. Hardly any liquidation was done at the board; those who were on the wrong side of the stock went down on their knees to the bears and made the best arrangement they could. The fall under the train in this stock were transferred yesterday. The settlements have pretty well all been made. The half-yearly dividend of Federal will be declared a week from to-day, and the insiders say confidently that it will be one of five per cent. But this will not help the stock a great deal.

The Situation in Montreal.

MONTEAL, Oct. 15.—The excitement attendant here on Saturday over the financial embarrassment of D. Morris & Co., dry goods merchants, outside this morning on it becoming generally known that the leading bank here resolved to carry the house through what is only looked on as its temporary trouble. Matters have been in that way all day, with business of the city going on as usual. The notes matured to day are held over until Wednesday, when a meeting of bankers will take place to ratify the agreement of the two banks to continue to sustain the firm. There is not a single new development in connection with the affair since Saturday. There is a feeling existing among bankers that all that is wanted to carry the house over its troubles is a little time and they are willing to give that. The belief is that one hundred cents on the dollar will be paid to creditors, who are banks almost solely. The crisis has come from the firm assisting mills to carry on and taking cotton as security, which the goods are lying on the firm's hands with no demand for them. The total amount in the banks here is under two millions. The assets show a surplus of \$300,000 at least. There is no doubt whatever of the house going ahead as before the trouble has resolved to carry on.

Civil Rights in the United States.

WASHINGTON, Oct. 15.—A decision was rendered in the supreme court of the United States to-day in five civil rights cases based on the first and second sections of the civil rights act of March 1, 1875. They are respectively: *Wong Kim Ark*, *Yick Wo*, *Chong Fook Tin*, *Chong Fook Tin*, and *Chong Fook Tin*. The court has not admitted certain colored persons to equal accommodations and privileges in inns, railroad cars and theaters. The court holds the congress has no constitutional authority to pass the sections in question under either the 13th or 14th amendments. The decision is binding on all states and not in the territories or the districts of Columbia where the sections of the act are concerned. The two sections of the law referred to are declared unconstitutional and void.

Switchemen on Strike.

ST. LOUIS, Oct. 15.—The switchmen on all railroads centering in St. Louis and East St. Louis at noon demanded that ten hours constituted a day's work, extra pay for Sunday and thirty cents an hour for all time over ten hours, besides \$56 a month for 26 working days. The strikers number 600 and will probably cause a blockade in freight east of St. Louis.

Threatened strike of Locomotive Engineers.

CHATTANOOGA, Tenn., Oct. 15.—Three engineers on the East Tennessee, Virginia and Georgia railroad were suspended to-day for striking. The brotherhood has demanded their reinstatement which the railroad refuses. It is probable that all the engineers on the road will resign.

Horses Killed by Gas.

CINCINNATI, Oct. 14.—The pipe used to conduct ammonia gas in Morley's brewery burst to-night where it passed through the stable. The gas escaped and twenty-three horses were killed in a few minutes.
