Local Produce Markets. FARMERS' MARKET—Five hundred bushels of wheat sold at 80c to 82c for spring and fall, 66c to 68c for goose. Five hundred bushels of barley were purchased at prices ranging from 70c to 72c, the bulk of it selling at 81c. One brought 23c and 34c, peas 57c to 60c. Timothy hay sold at \$11 to \$14, clover at \$7 to \$10. Straw \$7 to \$10. Potatoes are selling by the load at 40c, single bags 50c. Apples may be had at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per barrel.
