No matter, if a single paper is missing, the hoy is represented as careless and lazy, his protestations that he really delivered the paper are often disbelieved. The subscriber did not receive it; that is sufficient, he is censured, or more frequently fined, and not unfrequently dismissed.

A boy was discharged for carelessness. A paper had missed three times in succession. He protested that he had left the paper on the steps, there being no other place to put it.


