

Bogus subscription agents were operating in Western Canada for some time, purporting to be represent-atives of the Canadian Subscription Com-pany. Before the police could take action the swindlers escaped to the United States. One of the most active of those reported to the police was R. H. Rede. The post-al department declares that it has evid-ence that this form of swindle is being revived. The fake agents in most cases offer subscriptions to well-known publica-tions at far below the regular rates, pro-vided a cash payment is made in advance.


A. D. Donald, of Bosanquet, sustained slight injuries about the head and face by being thrown from his cutter.
