Good Cows Plus Fifty Per Cent

The man familiar with cows may make a fairly close estimate of what anyone in a given herd will give, possibly per day, per month or per year. Does it follow she is the "best" cow? It depends somewhat on what the owner is after; he may look for a large flow of milk, he may require plenty of cream, or, wisely, he may expect a substantial profit above the cost of feed. So your cows, as a herd, may average 6,000 pounds of milk and 200 pounds of fat, but is each one earning a good profit? Cow testing, checking up each individual, will answer this and many other questions. It will also help, as it has helped many dairymen, to add at least fifty per cent. to their income from the same number of cows, because they keep those that are known to be efficient. Your average may be 7,000 pounds, but in three years perhaps you can make it over 10,000 pounds, but it won't be unless each one is up to a good standard. Write the Dairy Commissioner Ottawa, for milk record forms. Your letter does not need a postage stamp.

Splendid Successes

The splendid successes of the British armies in Mesopotamia and on the west front will send a thrill of joy throughout the Empire. Along the Tigris, General Maude's brave men have achieved a brilliant success against the forces of the Turks, culminating in the capture of Kut-el Amara, a point seized by the Sultan's troops a year ago. The fall of Bagdad to the British seems likely now.

On the west front, the forces of Field Marshal Haid and General Nivelle have pushed the Germans back for more than four miles on a front eleven miles wide. This is the greatest German retreat in two years and even more valuable than the actual gain, is the knowledge thus secured that the Teuton lines can be broken at any time the Entente generals say the word.

Fake Magazine Agents

Because of the activities of fake "magazine agents," the postal authorities are warning the public to beware of this type of swindle. Bogus subscription agents were operating in Western Canada for some time, purporting to be representatives of the Canadian Subscription Company. Before the police could take action the swindlers escaped to the United States. One of the most active of those reported to the police was R. H. Reede. The postal department declares that it has evidence that this form of swindle is being revived. The fake agents in most cases offer subscriptions to well-known publications at far below the regular rates, provided a cash payment is made in advance.

About 4 years ago the child (then 3 years old) was playing in the yard when her father was drawing logs. By some means the log rolled on the child's leg tearing the flesh from the knee to the foot. Since that time every endeavor of the doctors have been made to save the limb without avail.

Detroit merchants are reaping a rich harvest these days at the expense of Canadian customers. Present a \$1 bill at almost any store or amusement place in Detroit you get "nicked" to the extent of five cents. The same amount is deducted from a \$2 bill and ten cents is taken off a \$5 note when the change is handed back. Explaining this, the clerk will say that "the bank charges a discount" on all such money taken. It is not the bank which makes the charge. The same amount is deducted from the money gets the rake-off. The exchange on Canadian money is one-quarter of one per cent, and the present condition is only temporary, according to Windsor and Detroit bankers.
