By the same paper we are informed that Mexscan news of the 8th June had reached New Orleans, announcing that General Urrea had been appointed generaliss mo of the Mexican Army against Texas, with authority to race 15,000 men, for which purpose \$600,000 . id been placed at his disposal. It is also stated, that Mr Packenham the British Minister, had expressed his sympathy at the unfortunate taking of the General in Chief of the Army of operations in Texas; and in connection with this, it was remouted, both at Jamaica and New Orleans, that the English contemplated some indirect interferance on behalf of the Mexicans, in confirmation of which it is further stated, that an armament was in preparation at Jamaica, and that two vessels had already been hired for this purpose.


