EDITORIAL OPINIONS.

It has been our custom to issue a special Holiday Number et the beginning of each year, ever since we began publication, some three years ago. Our first special issue consisted of only twelve pages, our second contained sixteen, and third, which was issued January 1st, 1899, contained sixty pages, being the largest number of any philatelic paper in Canada. We had intended getting out a one hundred page issue to celebrate the 20th century, but whether we succeed or not has yet to be decided: it will appear about January 15th 1899. We grant our usual reduction on ads the prices being:-One page \$1.50, Half page \$1.25, Quarter page \$1.00, two inches 65c, one inch 35c. Those advertisers who wish to secure good space should send in copy immediately, as those sending in ads first receive best space. If more than one page is taken by one advertiser, the price will be 3 pages for \$4.00. Remember, that your ad. will not be inserted unless cash accompanies your order. The circulation of this issue will be 5,000. In Canada, alone, we have over 900 sulscribers, so any dealer wishing to secure good Canadian custom should have a one page ad at least. We intend having interesting and instructive articles by wellinformed writers. We can also use a few good articles in exchange for ad space.
