heating and plumbing were asked for the 10th.—Tenders are asked for the construction of the principal pavilion for the provincial exhibition, the total cost being about \$30,000.—Same architects have received instructions from Mr. D. Morgan for the reconstruction of the old building of the Journal de Quebec, and repairing of stores; cost \$20,000. They are also making plans for an annex to the residence of Mr. L. J. Demers, Grande Allee, \$1,000, and a project for four suburban villas, amounting to \$15,000.—Tanguay & Vallee, architects, are preparing plans for the repairing of the manufactory for Mr. G. E. Amyot (old Bresse factory), a suburban residence for Mr. C. J. Magnon, works at the Patronage Cote d'Abraham, the enlarging of the Sacred Heart asylum, and are collaborating with Mr. J. J. Verret for the plans of the new seminary at Sherbrooke. These works represent a value of about \$500,000.—David Ouellet, architect, has begun the construction of a new building for the Sisters of Charity, Richelieu street, and has also prepared plans for a group of city dwellings that Hon. Justice Chauveau is going to build on the site of the old city hall, and which comprises a block of 50 rooms 120 feet deep on Urseline lane and 40 feet frontage on St. Ursule street, and nine other residences, comprising five on St. Louis street and four on St. Ursule street. Mr. Ouellet has also prepared plans for the Bell Telephone Company's building, but the construction is postponed.—H. Staveland, architect, has now in hand about \$50,000 worth of work, consisting of eight buildings in Quebec or neighborhood.—E. M. Talbot, architect, has in course of preparation plans for buildings to cost \$22,500 for Mr. G. Brocher, Bienville; C. E. Provost, Levis; Jos. Bergeron, Quebec; and four other residences in Quebec and Levis.—David Ouellet, architect, 117 St. John street, is asking tenders till June 1st for woodwork for the new building of the Sisters of Charity, Richelieu street. Copies of plans and

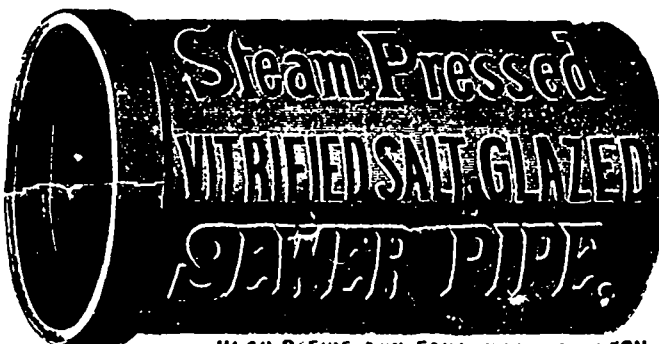

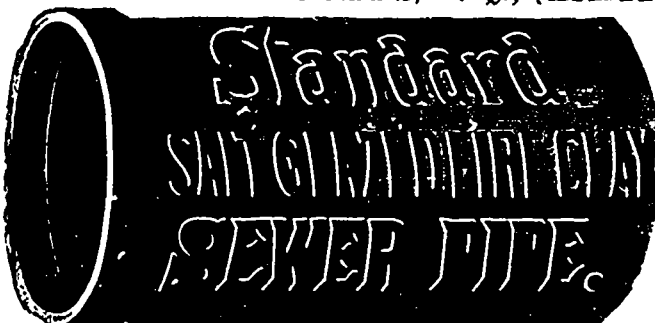
