"Pathet Lao" since April, 1953 and February, 1954, whereas the "Pathet Lao" forces controlled at this time large areas in the 10 other provinces. But we have reached the limit of our concessions and we consider that the Agreement giving the "Pathet Lao" the two provinces as a Provisional Assembly Area, pending a political solution which will settle the problem of unification of Laos, is an entirely reasonable measure, consistent with our sentiments and our peaceful stand which always remains unchanged from the beginning till the present.
