Now that I know an act respecting the territorial seas of Canada has come back from the other place I must advise the house that it is our intention to have it dealt with as the third item, that is, after the resolution preceding the bill to amend the Bank Act and the Quebec Savings Bank Act.

Otherwise the order of business will be the same as announced but, as I said earlier this morning, there will be a supply motion next week, probably on Wednesday; and on next Friday the estimates which we will take will be those of the Department of Public Works, which will be followed by those of the Department of Citizenship and Immigration.

Mr. Knowles: When the minister said a supply motion on Wednesday I assume he meant interim supply, which does not require a motion.

Mr. Favreau: Interim supply.

Mr. Barnett: Might I be permitted to ask the Minister of Justice, in reference to the bill concerning the territorial seas, whether it is the intention of the government to have this bill referred to the standing committee on marine and fisheries following second reading?

Mr. Favreau: We will be in a position to advise the house of that on Tuesday, Mr. Speaker.
