(b) Campground standpipes and all couplings used in campgrounds and for forest fire protection are $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch standard forestry type CSA B 89-1954 with $11\frac{1}{2}$ threads per inch.

2. (a) For hoses and fire fighting equipment using $2\frac{1}{2}$ inch couplings—Arrangements are being made to obtain a supply of adaptors which will allow Alberta equipment to be used with the present Jasper hydrants and couplings. (b) For hoses, pumps and fire fighting equipment using $1\frac{1}{2}$ inch couplings— Yes.
