‘ Colonization Reserves will intensify co-
‘ lonization undertakings in certain fixed
‘ zones, separate and distinguished from for-
‘ est reserves, which latter will thus be pre-

‘ from them the dangers to which they have
‘ been exposed through squatterism.

‘ The Provincial Government is thorough-
