"Can American lumber, manifactured in the prosince of dew brumswick by a coppora. ton orgamed under the laws of Naine and Whose stockholders are American citizens cesiding in New branswick, be reshippred to the United States free of duty ; and how, if at stock is held bye persons who afe some of the ciltocth or by bersons who, alhourbis Amerisan chazeds or ber persons who, allhongh American
conzens, are not revidents of Niew Brunswick?" There was some doubt about the law con ained in section 20 of the Dingley tariff act which says:
"The produce of the forests of the state of Maine buon the Si. John river and its tollutaries, owned by dmerican citizens and sawed or hewed in the prownce of New Branswick by American citiens, the same hempe othernise manufactured in whole or in pant. which is now admitted mothe ports of the C'nited States free of cluty, shalt cominue to be so admated, under such repulations as the sectetary of the treasumy shall from time to time prescribee."
