

The Dominion department of trade and commerce has published an interesting pamphlet on Canadian trade development for the information of the delegates attending the fifth Congress of the League of Nations. The pamphlet, which is assembled at Montreal. The first item in the pamphlet shows the expansion of trade since 1871. In 1871 the trade of Canada imported and exported amounted to \$170,266,589; 30 years later, in 1901, this had grown to \$1,000,000,000. In the next 20 years it has grown to \$667,001,404, or almost half as much as it increased in the ten years between 1891 and 1901. In 1871 the trade of the country was \$218,854,939. In the next 20 years it grew to \$1,000,000,000. The percentage of growth of the trade is higher by about double that of the United States and by three times that of Great Britain.
