

NORTHWEST ARM, HALIFAX

Out on the picturesque North West Arm—in its sheltered coves, or in the woods on either side, one might be miles away from any city. No sight or sound from the busy town comes to spoil one's enjoyment, yet within half an hour one could be in its busiest thoroughfare. There is excellent tathing, boating, and sailing. There are delightful beaches, where one may land and picnic or roam about the woods and parks. Melville Island, with its quaint old military prison, lies at one side of Melville Cove, a beautiful little bay, where one has glimpses of brightly-painted bungalows between the trees which overhang the banks and cast deep shadowy reflections in the still waters. Numerous gaily-painted canoes and boats with bright sails add life and beauty to the scene.
